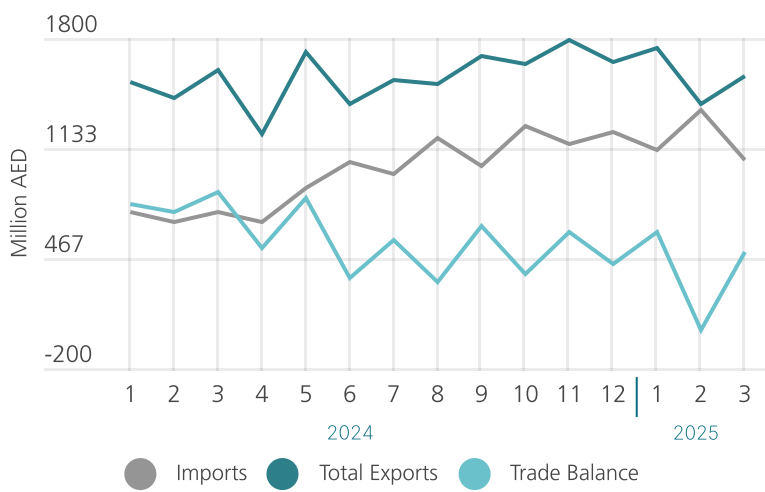
First Quarter 2025



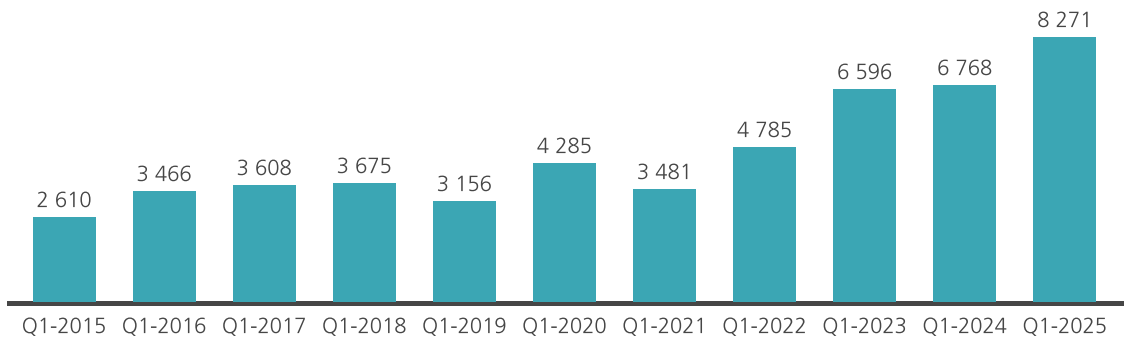
A quarterly bulletin issued by Ras Al Khaimah Center for Statistics, contains foreign trade data received from the Customs Department in Ras Al Khaimah, which includes trade movement data made through the emirate's ports.

Main Points

Introduction

Foreign trade Statistics are important statistics, they enable the production of a wide group of statistical indicators that show movement of goods that entered or exited from emirates ports (Marine, land, and air). The department of customs in Ras Al Khaimah is the main source of the data, as it monitors the trade movement through 12 custom centers in the emirate.

The data in the report, covers all the trade movement through the emirate's ports to the outside world; it does not include trade transactions of Ras Al Khaimah done through the ports in other emirates.

The center has adopted the general trade system in producing trade data based on international recommendations to adopt this system to produce the data.

The center extends its sincere thanks to the customs department in Ras Al Khaimah for its full collaboration with the center in providing the data to produce the foreign trade statistics.

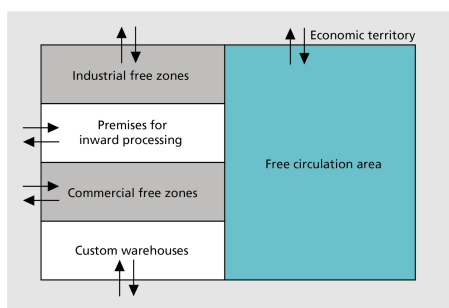

- "-" = The value equals zero.

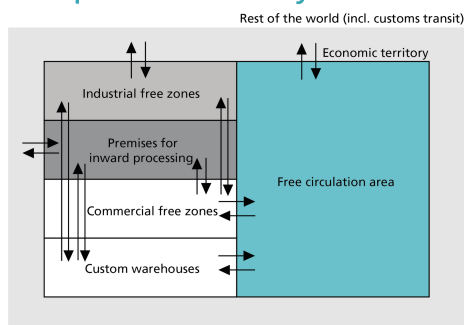
Concepts and Terminology

- **The economic territory:** is the area under the effective economic control of a single Government in which it gets things done effectively.
- **The General trade system and the Special trade system:** The general trade system is in use when the statistical territory in a country coincides with the economic territory. While the special trade system is in use when the statistical territory comprises only a particular part of the economic territory.

General trade System



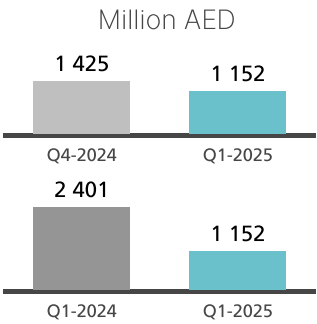
Special trade system



Trade Balance & Imports

Trade Balance

The trade balance has a surplus of 1152 million dirhams in the first quarter of 2025, decreasing by 19% in comparison with the fourth quarter of 2024, and has decreased by 52% in comparison with the same quarter of the previous year.



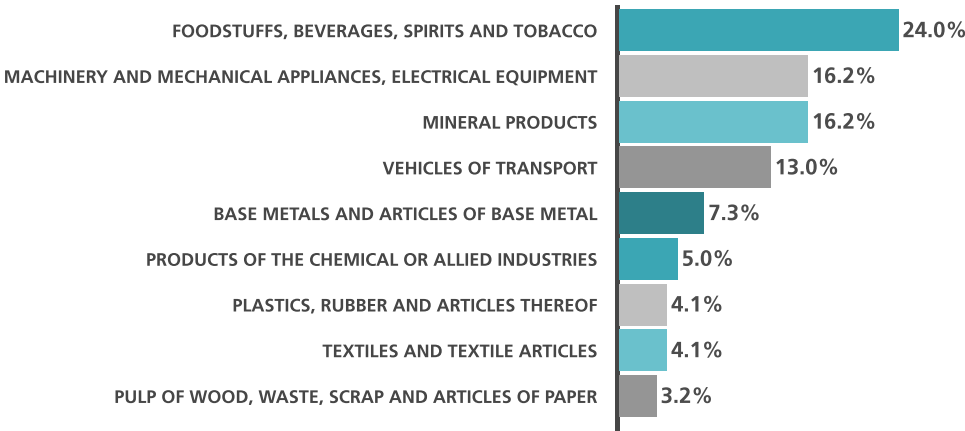
Imports

The total imports were 3559 million dirhams in the first quarter of 2025, compared with 3647 million dirhams in the fourth quarter of 2024, decreasing by 2%. Compared with the same quarter of the previous year, the data showed an increase of approximately 63%.

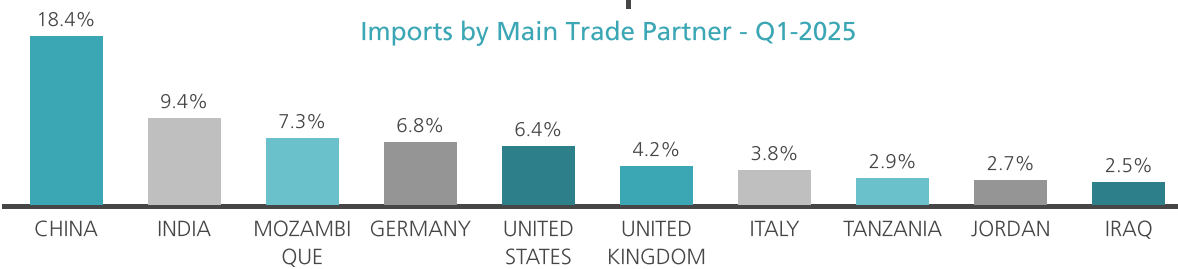
As for the country of origin, 18% of the imports were from China, 9% from India, and 7% from Mozambique.

As for the types of the imported goods, the data showed that the imports of foodstuffs, beverages, spirits, and tobacco products were in the first place with a value of around 854 million dirhams, followed by machinery and mechanical appliances, electrical equipment with 578 million dirhams and mineral products with 577 million dirhams.

Imports by Main Trade Partner - Q1-2025



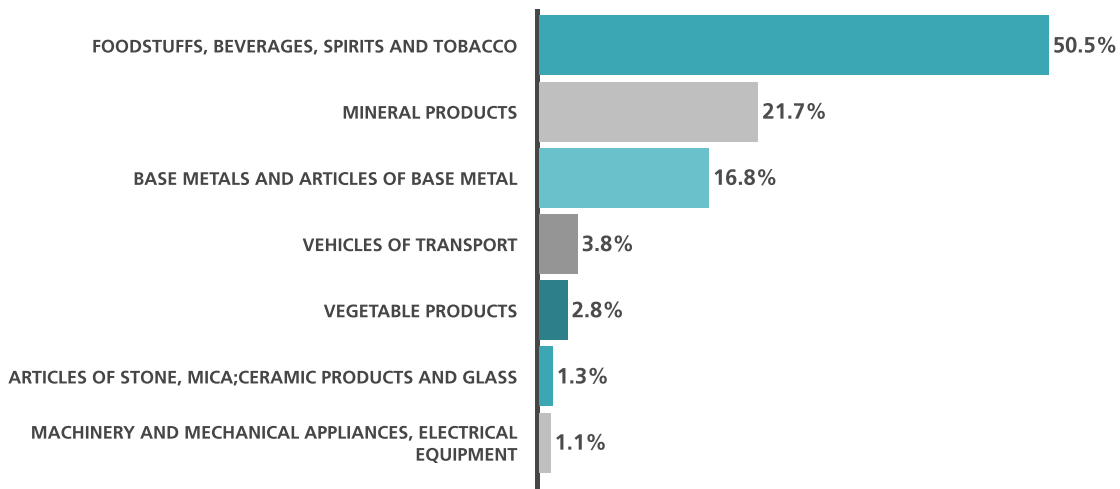
Exports

In comparison with the fourth quarter of 2024, exports decreased by 10% in the first quarter of 2024 and reached around 3715 million dirhams in the first quarter of 2025. By comparing it with the first quarter of the previous year (2024), it decreased by 2%, where the total exports were 3807 million dirhams.

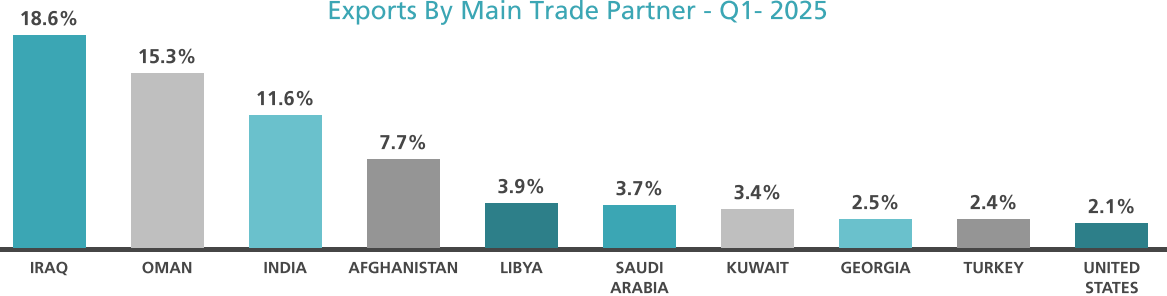
The data showed that most of the exports were in the foodstuffs, beverages, spirits and tobacco products; the exports of this group were around 1876 million dirhams, followed by mineral products with 805 million dirhams.

Based on the destination, exports to Iraq were 19% in the first quarter of the year, exports to Oman were 15%, and exports to India were 12% of total exports.

Exports By Main Trade Partner - Q1- 2025

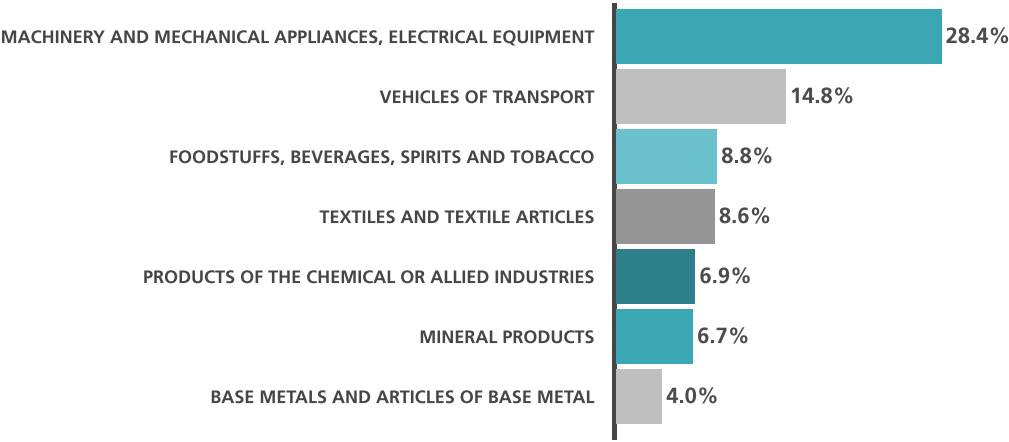


Re-exports

In the first quarter of 2025, the total of re-exports was around 997 million dirhams, increasing by 4% in comparison with the previous quarter (Q4 - 2024). By comparing it with the first quarter of the previous year, data shows that there is an increase in re-exports by 28%. The data showed that re-exports of machinery and mechanical appliances, electrical equipment were 283 million dirhams and of vehicles of transport were around 147 million dirhams.

Based on the trade partner out of total re-exports, the re-exports to Oman were 63%, to Iraq 8%, and to Saudi Arabia 4%.

- **Methodology of the data production:** The data was produced based on the General System of Foreign Trade.
- **Coverage:** The data contains all the transactions of importing, exporting, and re-exporting, done through the customs ports of Ras Al Khaimah, therefore, the data in this report does not include the foreign trade data of the emirate of Ras Al Khaimah done through other emirates.
